

Day 1 - Middle Gobi / Baga Gazriin Chuluu (220 km)



Meet at your accommodation between 7:50 and 8:30 AM and start the tour to Genghis Khan Statue. This 40 m tall statue was built in a historical place and is the tallest equestrian statue in the world. See the Tuul River Valley and Genghis Khan's birthland Khan Khentii Mountains on the observation deck. Continue the journey to Baga Gazariin Chuluu, a zone of granite stone mountains; the highest peak is 1700 m above sea level. It has been keeping some historical remains, such as the ruins of a monastery, ancient tombs, and rock inscriptions. Challenge your imagination by

seeing the unique features of the granite formations in Baga Gazariin Chuluu, discover the old monastery ruins, and enjoy the emptiness and calmness of the Gobi Desert.

Dinner and overnight stay in a ger camp.


Day 2 - Middle Gobi / Tsagaan Suvarga (280 km)

Tsagaan Suvarga means "White Stupa." It is one of the most famous highlights in the Gobi. Tsagaan Suvarga is a strange natural formation of colorful, massive mud cliffs that look like stupas, mound-like structures containing relics. Hiking through the cliffs offers the chance to take amazing photographs.

Day 3 - South Gobi / Yol Valley (280km)



Yolyn Am, or Lammergeier Valley, beautiful and high elevated gorges forming incredible canyons. Gorges are so high thus sunlight never reaches the floor and winter's snow can be kept good even in summer time.

These areas are situated in the Gobi Gurvan Saikhan /Three Beauties of the Gobi/ National park, the most easterly points of the Altai Mountains.

Overnight in tourist camp. (B+L+D)

Dinner and overnight stay in a ger camp. Meal: B/L/D

Day 4 - South Gobi / Khongor Sand Dunes (200 km)

Drive to the "[Khongoryn els](#)" - the biggest sand dune in Mongolia, reaching a height of 200 meters in some areas. Discuss with your guide about timing when you climb over dunes.

Explore the dune area on the camelback. The two-humped Bactrian camels are very comfortable to ride as they walk slowly and gently. You will be well supported by their soft, fluffy humps when you ride them. Our camel guide will lead you safely through the sand dunes to explore the Uujim valley on the camelback. You will have an opportunity to visit a camel herdsman family to experience their lifestyle, culture and traditions.

Similar to other deserts, the chance of rain/cloud is slim. So that there is a chance to gaze at the billions of stars in the evening.

Overnight in tourist camp. (B+L+D) (Approx. dirt road 200 km, 5 hours, camel ride 1 hour)

Dinner and overnight in a ger camp. Meal: B/L/D



Day 5 - South Gobi / Bayanzag (150 km)



Drive to the Bayanzag, also known as the [Flaming Cliffs](#), where the first dinosaur eggs were discovered in 1922 by Roy Chapman Andrews. In this huge paleontological site, you will have a chance to walk on the ground where the Dinosaurs once roamed 60 million years ago.

On this day, you will discover not only dinosaur's but ancient human's remains too. Khavtsgait petroglyphs and saxual forest are good additions to this trip.

Photo shooting of the flaming cliffs and watching a documentary about this wonderful place is suggested in the evening

Dinner and overnight in a ger camp. Meal: B/L/D

Day 6 - Middle Gobi / Ongi Monastery (150 km)

Drive first through slate mountains and next on 80 km Ongi steppes leading to Ongi Monastery, one of the biggest seven monasteries in Mongolia. There were two separate monasteries consisting of more than 30 temples on



the shores of the Ongi River surrounded by the Gobi mountains; however, the temples were destroyed during the socialist purge of the 1930s. Now the ruins of the monasteries cover a huge area. Visit a new active temple, a ger museum, explore the monastery ruins and climb a nearby mountain to have panoramic views of the surrounding areas.

Middle Gobi / Ongi Monastery Activity: Drive north, visit Ongi Monastery ruins, explore the area. Dinner and overnight in a ger camp. Meal: B/L/D

Day 7: Kharkhorin, ancient Monastery Erdenezuu (280 km)

This day's tour takes place in the transition zone from the Gobi desert to the mountain steppes. Kharkhorin, formerly known as Kharakhorum, was once a capital of Chinggis Khaan's Great Mongol Empire in the 13th century. After the move of the Mongolian capital to Beijing, and the fall of the Empire, Karakorum was abandoned and then destroyed by Manchurian soldiers in 1388. Today, in the vast valley of the Orkhon River, the awe-inspiring ancient [monastery Erdenezuu](#) coexists with Kharkhorin town. See some valuable religious artifacts in the monastery museum, view its stunning architecture and the Kharakhorum Museum display remnants of the ancient city.

Dinner and overnight in a ger camp. Meal: B/L/D



Day 8: Hustai National Park (200 km)



Hustai National Park. This area is home to the Mongolian wild horse known as Przewalski horse (takhi) with a unique landscape that features mountain and steppe. After lunch at Hustai camp, we will visit a small Information center about the wild horse Takhi. Then we will take a short drive to see for wild horse Takhi. There is a great opportunity to take a photo of these endangered horses.

Dinner and overnight in a ger camp. Meal: B/L/D

Day 9: Ulaanbaatar city (100 km)

Free hotel check-in and additional activities to explore Ulaanbaatar in the afternoon.

Accommodation: 3* hotel

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch



Day 10: Departure

The driver transfers you to the airport/trains station. End of the tour.

Meals: Breakfast
